# FACTSHEET – SCACP (Support for Conflict-affected Communities Project)

### **Objectives**

To translate the formal peace process into tangible benefits through quick and visible development projects in conflict-affected communities

### **Program Focus**

This grant is part of USAID's commitment to support the Indonesian Government in establishing a sustainable Peace in Aceh and generate momentum for implementation of the Helsinki Peace Agreement of August 2005. The program works in communities in Aceh's Central highlands that are isolated, severely affected by conflict and receive little attention.

SCACP responds to local demands by delivering community-identified projects that have visible economic and social impact (peace dividends). SCACP encompasses infrastructure projects, livelihoods support to vulnerable persons, sociocultural interventions, community journalism, and a wide package of training and other capacity-building activities. SCACP is implemented through local government and 22 local civil-society organizations in the Central Highlands; these partners facilitate and monitor project beneficiaries and grants-in-kind in more than 428 villages in Central Aceh, Bener Meriah, South-East Aceh, and Gayo Lues districts.

To date, 180,000 people in vulnerable communities in the Central Highlands have benefited from the program. SCACP's approach has directly addressed pervasive damage caused by the conflicts which have plagued the Central highlands over the past ten years – namely decrepit infrastructure, lack of access to basic services including health and education, scarce economic opportunity, and social fragmentation.
